



HOW TO ENROLL FOR CLASSES AT NORTHEAST STATE

1. Apply to the College

Admission requirements:

- Earn a high school diploma or GED and provide an official high school transcript that shows a graduation date or provide official GED scores
- Complete and submit a Northeast State Application for Admission that is available online at www.NortheastState.edu/apply.
- Request that an official copy of all transcripts be sent to Northeast State from other colleges or universities attended.
- Provide proof of immunization with two (2) doses of Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR) vaccine. This applies to all students born after Jan. 1, 1957.
- Submit a completed Northeast State Hepatitis B Immunization Health History Form.
- Present valid testing scores or undergo assessment for course placement. (See page 20.)

2. Apply for Financial Aid

Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Forms are available online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Students and their parents (if dependent) should apply first for a PIN at www.pin.ed.gov so that they can sign the form electronically. The Northeast State school code is 005378.

3. Schedule Orientation and Register for Your Classes

New Students – Once your admission file is complete call Enrollment Services at 423.323.0229 to schedule a time for registration/orientation.

Transfer Students – Students that have attended another college or university other than Northeast State. Once your admission file is complete, you may contact Enrollment Services at 423.323.0229 to schedule a registration date.

Returning Students – If you have previously attended Northeast State, you are considered a returning student. If it has been more than one semester since you attended Northeast State, you must submit an Application for Readmission. All returning students should meet with their advisor prior to registering for courses during the designated times for advisement and registration.

4. Pay Your Fees

Your fees must be paid. Please see "Payment of Tuition and Fees" on page 13 for more information.

5. Get Your Student ID

Student IDs are obtained in the Admissions and Records Office in the Pierce Building on the main campus in Blountville. To get your student ID, you must present a photo ID, such as your driver's license.

6. Purchase Your Textbooks

The bookstore at Northeast State is operated for the convenience of faculty, staff, and students. The bookstore stocks textbooks and educational supplies needed by students enrolled in an academic program. The store also maintains a supply of other items such as caps and shirts imprinted with the College's logo.

7. Get Your Parking Hangtag

Every student must have a parking permit regardless of the site they attend. Parking permits can be obtained at the Welcome Center on the Blountville campus. There is no additional cost for a parking tag.

8. Go to Class

Before your classes start, make sure you know where they are located. You are welcome to walk around the campus and locate your classes or call Campus Information at 423.323.0243 for a tour. Be sure to print out a copy of your schedule using our NORSTAR system.

HOW TO SEARCH FOR CLASSES

- 1. Go to the Northeast State Web site at www.NortheastState.edu.
- 2. Click on the NORSTAR icon at the bottom of the Northeast State home page.
- 3. Click on Class Schedule.
- 4. Select the appropriate term and click "Submit."
- 5. Highlight the subject and type in the course number you want to look for (example: ENGL 1010).
- 6. Start/End Time If you have specific times that you need to arrive and depart from campus, select a starting and ending time; however, for best results, leave this area blank and it will bring up all classes.
- 7. Days If you have specific days you wish to attend class, click those; however, for best results, leave this area blank and it will bring up all classes.
- 8. Click on "Class Search" and this screen will show information for the class you have chosen.
- 9. The Class Schedule Listing page will show meeting information, instructor name, and the location where the class is taught.
- 10. By clicking on the course title, highlighted in blue (example: ENGL 1010), you will view the availability of seats in this class.
- 11. By clicking on the "View Catalog Entry" you may view a brief description of the class and any required prerequisites.

NORTHEAST STATE HONORS PROGRAM

The Honors Program offers able and highly motivated students the chance to do advanced work in smaller class sections and is open to first-time, transfer, and returning students. Admittance to the Honors Program as a first-semester freshman requires an ACT composite score of 25 or an SAT combined score of 1140. Students who have completed 12 hours of college-level course work with a grade point average of 3.25 or better may apply regardless of ACT or SAT scores.

Honors classes are marked as such on the student's transcript. Students who complete 12 hours or more in the Honors Program will be recognized during the college's Honors Convocation. A graduating student who completes 18 hours of Honors course work at Northeast State will receive a diploma that records completion of the Honors Program.

Honors course sections are offered to satisfy most of the general education requirements students will need for a degree:

- English Composition
- History
- Literature
- Humanities
- Mathematics
- Science
- Behavioral/Social Sciences
- Speech

PAYMENT OF TUITION AND FEES

All fees are payable at the time of registration each semester. Registration dates and payment due dates are listed in this publication in the semester calendars. Student schedules are deleted if fees are not paid by the applicable due date. Registration is not complete until all fees are paid and no student may attend class without having met all financial obligations.

The Late Registration/Payment fee goes into effect on the first day of classes as noted in the semester calendars. Students whose fees are paid by an outside source must ensure that all appropriate paperwork from the paying agency is on file in the Business Office prior to the last day to pay for early registration.

No student may re-enroll, graduate, or receive a transcript or grades until all financial obligations to Northeast State are met. All charges are subject to subsequent audit. Errors will be corrected by refund or additional charge.

The Business Office is located on the first floor of the Pierce Administration Building at the Northeast State campus in Blountville. Regular office hours are Monday-Thursday, 8 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., and Friday 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. when classes are in session. When classes are not in session, office hours are Monday-Friday, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Methods of Payment

Students at Northeast State can pay their fees several different ways. Fees may be paid at the Business Office window, which is on the first floor of the Pierce Administration Building on the main campus in Blountville, or by logging in to the NORSTAR registration system on the web. Northeast State accepts cash, checks, money orders, MasterCard, Visa, American Express, and Discover Card as methods of payment. Fees can be paid through the NORSTAR system by check or any major credit card.

By sending your completed, signed check to Northeast State Community College, you authorize Northeast State to copy your check and to use the account information from your check to make a one-time electronic fund transfer from your account for the same amount as the check. Funds will be withdrawn from your account within 24 hours and you will not receive your check back from your financial institution. The electronic fund transfer from your account will be on the account statement you receive from your financial institution. Copies will be held no longer than sixty (60) days.

Payment of Fees Online

Northeast State offers several different methods of payment online for your convenience. You can pay your fees online and/or set up a payment plan at www.NortheastState.edu through the NORSTAR system. You may pay online using a check, MasterCard, Visa, American Express, or Discover Card. To pay your fees online follow the steps below:

- 3. Select "Enter Secure Area (*For Student Services)".
- 4. Enter your user ID and PIN and log in to the NORSTAR system.

- 7. Choose your payment type:
 - a. Pay by Check
 - i. Select the correct term and click on "Submit."
 - ii. Enter your payment information according to the instructions on the page.
 - iii. Click on the "Continue" button at the bottom of the page. Please only click on this button one time.
 - b. Pay by Credit Card
 - i. Select the correct term and click on "Submit."
 - ii. Enter your payment information according to the instructions on the page.
 - iii. Click on the "Submit Payment" button. Please only click this button one time.
 - c. Set up a Payment Plan (FACTS)
 - i. Select the correct term and click "Submit."
 - ii. Review the summary and click the e-Cashier logo at the bottom of the page.
 - iii. Follow the instructions within e-Cashier to complete the payment plan setup.

FACTS/e-CASHIER TARGET DATES

FACTS/e-Cashier Payment Plans (Available fall and spring only)

To help meet educational expenses each semester, Northeast State is pleased to offer FACTS, a convenient payment plan. It is not a loan; therefore, there is no debt, and no interest or finance charges are assessed. No credit check is required.

Payment Plan Overview

A \$25.00 per semester nonrefundable fee is required. The FACTS Enrollment Fee is automatically deducted from your account WITHIN 14 days of the date of your agreement. Payments are automatically deducted on the 5th of each month from a designated checking or savings account, or you may also have your payment charged to a credit card. If you elect to use a credit card, only Visa, MasterCard, Discover, and American Express are accepted.

Fall 2010

e-Cashier is available on April 5, 2010. July 1, 0% down (4 payment option). July 23, 25% down (3 payment option). Aug. 20, 50% down (2 payment option). Aug. 27, 50% down (1 payment option).

Spring 2011

e-Cashier is available on Nov. 8, 2010. Nov. 22, 25% down (3 payment option). Dec. 21, 50% down (2 payment option). Jan. 12, 50% down (1 payment option).

Note: 50% of the student's account must be paid by the first day of class.

MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION

Residency Classification

Students are classified as resident or non-resident by the office of Admissions and Records for the purpose of assessing tuition charges. The definition of residency as determined by the Tennessee Board of Regents will apply. A student once classified as an out-of-state student will continue to be thus classified unless a change of legal residence is established by evidence other than presence as a student. The burden of proof of all conditions pertaining to residence is placed upon the student, including the responsibility for submission of documentation required by Northeast State. If there is any question as to in-state residency at the time of registration, the student will be classified as out-of-state and will be charged out-of-state tuition. Information about residency classification may be obtained from the office of Admissions and Records. If a student believes they have been incorrectly classified as out-of-state, they may complete and submit a Residency Information Form (available in the office of Admissions and Records).

Refund of Fees

Refunds are defined as that portion of maintenance fees and/or tuition due to be returned to the student when a student withdraws or is expelled from college. The amount of refund is determined by the institutional refund policy. The refunded amount will reduce the amount of unpaid charges the student owes the institution. For additional information or clarification of this policy, please contact the Business Office at 423.354.2511.

Return of Title IV Funds for Financial Aid Recipients

Students who withdraw from all classes prior to completing more than 60 percent of an enrollment term will have their earned portion of Title IV aid (federal financial aid) calculated based on the percent of the term they complete. Students may owe a repayment to the U.S. Department of Education and a portion of the funds used to pay the student's tuition and fees may have to be returned according to the Federal Return of Title IV Funds.

Title IV Funds Policy

Students will be responsible for any portion of their institutional charges that may remain unpaid after Title IV funds are returned. For additional information or clarification of this policy, please contact the Financial Aid Office at 423.323.0252.

Eligibility for Deferment of Payment of Tuition and Fees by Certain Eligible Students Receiving U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs or Other Governmentally Funded Educational Assistance Benefits

Service members, veterans, and dependents of veterans who are eligible beneficiaries of U. S. Department of Veterans Affairs education benefits or other governmentally funded educational assistance, subject to the conditions and guidelines set forth in Tennessee Code Annotated 49-7-104 as amended, may elect, upon formal application, to defer payment of required tuition and fees until the final day of the term for which the deferment has been requested. Application for the deferment must be made no later than 14 days after the beginning of **each** term, and the amount of the deferment shall not exceed the total monetary benefits to be received for the term. Students who have been granted deferments are expected to make timely payments on their outstanding tuition and fees balance once education benefits are being delivered, and eligibility for such deferment shall terminate if the student fails to abide by any applicable rule or regulation, or to act in good faith in making timely payments. This notice is published pursuant to Public Chapter 279, Acts of 2003, effective July 1, 2003.





To start getting the answers you need, click on "NORSTAR" located on the black tool bar or the icon at the bottom of the Northeast State home page screen. Once you are at the NORSTAR home page you are able to access a variety of information. Only students that have submitted a Northeast State application can log on to the student services icon.

- Click the appropriate registration session (i.e. Spring, Fall)
- Enter Secure Area for Student Services
- Type in your Student ID number
- Type in your PIN which is your six-digit birthdate (MMDDYY). You will be required to change your PIN after your initial log-in.
- Click "Log-in" and you will be asked to provide a log-in verification security question and answer click "Submit"
- Click "Student"
- Click "Registration"
- Click "Add or Drop Classes"
- Choose the term for which you want to register and click "Submit"
- Click on "Class Search" to look for the course offerings
- Select the subject and type in the course number you want to look for (ex: ENGL1010)
- Click "Class Search"
- Click the box beside the CRN of the course you want and click "Register" at the bottom of the screen
- Click "Registration Fee Assessment" located at the bottom of the screen for your semester bill
- Click "Student Detail Schedule" or "Week at a Glance" to view your schedule

Where to go for General Student Information:

On NORSTAR you will find a variety of information right at your finger tips. Students have access to their semester grades, faculty advisor, holds on their record, account summary, personal financial aid information, and much more. Students also have access to their unofficial transcript. If you have questions, please direct them to the Office of Enrollment Services and Student Information (P201 - 423.323.0243) or the Student Success Center (C2407 - 423.323.0214).

FINANCIAL AID

Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Forms are available online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Students and their parents (if dependent) should apply first for a PIN at www.pin.ed.gov so that they can sign the form electronically. The Northeast State school code is 005378.

Students who have been awarded and have registered on a full-time basis will have their accounts credited up to the level of award(s). Awards may need to be adjusted for students enrolled less than full-time. Any adjustments will automatically be made by the Financial Aid Office.

Students who have attended all classes and will be receiving a balance of aid check after fees are deduced will have their checks mailed to them or direct deposited after the census date (14th day of the semester). These are monies from Federal Pell, Academic Competitiveness Grant (ACG), FSEOG, TSAA, student loans, Tennessee Education Lottery Scholarships (TELS), and other scholarships listed on your award letter. You may also view your financial aid information on Norstar.

Students who have a credit balance on their account after financial aid has been credited may be able to charge their books during scheduled times each semester. The charges will then be deducted from the credit balance. Any remaining balance of aid will then either be mailed or direct deposited.

If a student becomes eligible for financial aid after the census date, a check or direct deposit for the total semester's award minus any fees owed, will be disbursed to the student after attendance for funds has been verified.

Federal Pell Grant, FSEOG, TSAA and TELS Awards will be adjusted up and down through the census date of each semester.

You may check the status of your account and the status of any balance of aid by going to your NORSTAR account under "Account Summary" or by contacting the Business Office. No one else can pick up your check for you.

If your fees will be covered by Direct Stafford Loan funds, you will need to check with the Financial Aid Office each semester prior to the fee due date to get a deferment put on your account until the loan funds are received by the College.

Return of Federal Financial Aid

Your federal financial aid eligibility must be recalculated if you withdraw, drop out, are dismissed, or take a leave of absence prior to completing 60% of a semester. Federal financial aid includes Federal Pell Grant, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG), Academic Competitiveness Grant (ACG), Direct Stafford Loans, and Federal Work Study.

The recalculation of eligibility is based on the percent of earned aid. Federal financial aid must be returned to the federal government based on the percent of unearned aid the student received for the semester. Any repayments owed to the Department of Education must be repaid before becoming eligible to receive financial aid assistance for future terms at any institution.

Northeast State Scholarship Programs

Several scholarship programs are available to qualified Northeast State students. The Academic Work Scholarship Program, the Educate and Grow Scholarship Program, the Educational Access and Diversity Scholarship Program, and the Northeast State Foundation Scholarships as well as other individuals and organizations provide awards for qualified students. Competitive scholarship awards are based primarily on academic merit with consideration given to a student's major, county of residence, demonstrated leadership skills, and motivation among other selection criteria. Financial need is not necessarily a prerequisite for receiving Northeast State scholarships.

Separate applications are required for each program, and additional eligibility criteria exist for each scholarship award. Submission deadlines vary for each program.

PLACEMENT AND TESTING

PLACEMENT

Degree-seeking students applying for admission to Northeast State undergo placement testing in English, reading, and algebra to ensure that each student is academically prepared to enter his or her chosen field of study. Based on placement test scores, a student may be placed in one or more development course(s). Students with transfer credit from another approved, regionally accredited postsecondary institution may waive the English and reading placement tests with a satisfactory grade in English composition and/or waive the algebra placement test with a satisfactory grade in an appropriate college-level mathematics course. Students with transfer credit will receive notification from the office of Admissions and Records when placement testing is required.

STUDENTS - 20 years old and younger

ACT and/or SAT scores are used for placement screening for students who are 20 years of age and younger. ACT and/or SAT scores must be earned within three years prior to the first day of a student's entering term in college in order to be valid.

High school graduates or GED recipients with an ACT subscore less than 19 in English, math, and/or reading are required to take the COMPASS.

High school graduates or GED recipients without valid ACT or SAT scores are encouraged to take a national ACT or SAT test before enrolling at Northeast State. ACT tests are scheduled throughout the year from September through June. Students may go online to www.actstudent.org to register for the ACT or contact a local high school for ACT registration packets. Students apply to Northeast State after the last scheduled June test may contact Testing Services at 423.323.0211 or testing @NortheastState.edu for information about testing.

STUDENTS - 21 years and older

First time college students or transfer students without satisfactory grades in English and/or math are required to take COMPASS Writing Skills and COMPASS Reading tests and/or COMPASS Algebra test.

All placement testing must be completed before students may schedule a date for New Student Orientation.

TESTING - COMPASS TEST

The COMPASS test is composed of three areas: Writing Skills, Reading, and Pre-Algebra/Algebra. It is computerized and untimed. Students should plan up to 2.5 hours to take all three areas of COMPASS, and less time for only one or two of the areas. COMPASS is a placement test, not a pass/fail test.

Prospective students are encouraged to take practice tests for Writing and Reading, and review pre-algebra and algebra questions by going online to www.NortheastState.edu/assessments and clicking on COMPASS.

The Northeast State application for admission must be processed, and the \$10.00 application fee and \$5.00 COMPASS fee must be paid before students may take the COMPASS. These fees may be paid in the Business Office, Room P105, in the Jame Pierce Administration Building, at any Northeast State location, or mailed to the Business Office, P.O. Box 246, Blountville, TN 37617. For additional information regarding payment, please call 423.354.2511.


COMPASS testing is administered on the Blountville campus. Day and evening testing times are available. Students are allowed one retest for a fee of \$20.00. A minimum two-week waiting period is required between the original test and the retest. Once a student has enrolled in the required course, retesting will not be allowed.





REGENTS ONLINE DEGREE PROGRAM COURSES INFORMATION

Regents Online Degree Program courses are another option for students to take classes at Northeast State. They are taught by instructors from Tennessee Board of Regents colleges and universities all across the state of Tennessee. You never have to physically attend a class, but you do have to be prepared to take a proctored (in person) mid-term and/or final exam. You do not have to be logged in to your RODP class at any certain time or day of the week. Courses are available for students to access 24/7. However, RODP courses have assignment/test due dates just like there are in any other class. **The only contact that students have with their RODP course instructors is through the RODP class email.**

Registration for these courses occurs by using the Northeast State NORSTAR system just like any other Northeast State class. RODP courses are designated in the "class look up" by the "**R50**" section.

ATTENTION: Students taking a section "R50" online class (Regents Online Degree Program – RODP), or **those considering taking an RODP** class, PLEASE READ ON!

To make certain that your RODP learning experience is an enjoyable one, here are a few instructions on "What To Do Next" after you register for an RODP online course.

- 1. Be sure that you have paid your tuition and fees by the due date so that you will not be purged/dropped from your class(es). Do not wait for a bill in the mail.
- 2. Fees and tuition for RODP courses are somewhat higher than fees and tuition for Northeast State courses. You will need to check current semester campus literature for the current tuition and fees rates. The 12-hour maximum tuition charge does **not** apply to RODP courses or a combination of Northeast State and RODP courses. Please see page 16 for more information.
- 3. You should expect to have to come to campus for a proctored mid-term and final exam. Some RODP courses require the midtern and/or final exam to be proctored in a supervised setting. The course syllabus will indicate if the midterm and/or final exams are proctored. Students who need a proctor may go to www.NortheastState.edu/rodp for information and to schedule exams.
- 4. Go as soon as possible to the RODP website, www.rodp.org, click on the "Bookstore" link located in the yellow pinned note on the right side of the page. Next click on "Find Your Textbook" and follow the steps to order your textbook so that you will have it when class begins. Note: The Northeast State Bookstore does not have RODP textbooks available in stock for purchase.
- 5. Complete the Online Orientation to E-Learning, available at www.rodp.org/orientation.
- 6. Click on the <u>Student Services</u> link (from www.rodp.org) and familiarize yourself with information that will be a key to having a successful semester: "Calendar," "Student Tools and Forms," and "Virtual Student Services" links. (PLEASE NOTE: UTILIZING THESE LINKS WILL ANSWER MANY OF YOUR QUESTIONS!)
 - In the <u>Enroll Today</u> link, by clicking "12 Steps," then clicking in step 2 "Frequently Asked Questions," then clicking "help.rodp.org." you will find a useful feature: **ASK RODP**. More than 20 questions and answers are listed. You also have the opportunity to e-mail a question, or get live help.
- 7. Do not attempt to log in prior to the first day of classes as given in the semester calendar. **Note: The Northeast State D2L ID and password will not work for RODP log in.**



SUMMER SCHOOL AND STUDENT PARKING



How Does Summer School Work at Northeast State?

Students may choose to take courses during four different time frames for Summer 2010:



Example A student could complete 12 credit hours by taking courses in the following format and never be enrolled in more than 2 courses at a time:

one 3 credit hour course during Intersession

one 3 credit hour course during First Summer Session

one 3 credit hour course during Second Summer Session

one 3 credit hour course during Full Summer Session

<u>Note</u>: Students should consult with the appropriate financial aid representative to ensure that financial aid eligibility requirements can be met prior to registering for the various summer semester sessions.

Student Parking

Parking permits are issued by the Police and Safety Office upon presentation of a current, paid fee receipt. There is no cost for Northeast State parking permits, and replacement permits are also available at no cost with proper documentation. Only one permit will be issued per student. 



Follow Memorial Blvd. to Ft. Henry Drive. Turn right on Ft. Henry Drive. You will pass Dobyns-Bennett High School on your right. Continue until you reach the intersection of Ft. Henry Dr. and Center St. Turn left on Center St. Follow Center St. to downtown Kingsport. City Hall will be on your left. Turn left on Clay St. The Kingsport Center for Higher Education will be on your right.

Northeast State at Elizabethton - 386 Highway 91 N Interstate 26 from Johnson City

Take exit 24 onto US 321 North toward Elizabethton (about 8.7 miles). Turn left onto Highway 19 and then exit right onto Highway 91 North toward Stoney Creek. Travel about 2.5 miles and turn right into the Northeast State at Elizabethton parking area.

Highway 19E from Bristol:

Turn left at intersection of Volunteer Parkway and Highway 19E and continue approximately 8 miles. Exit onto ramp for Highway 91 North and turn left. Drive about 2.5 miles and turn right into the Northeast State at Elizabethton parking area.

Northeast State at Gray - 104 Dillon Court

From Johnson City or Kingsport on I-126 take Exit 13 (Suncrest Dr., Gray Exit). Do not turn right as sign indicates, as that is direction to main campus in Blountville. Turn left at light onto Suncrest Dr. (Hwy 75) and drive about 1 mile. You will pass a Discount Bakery Shop on left. There is a sign indicating the Gray Industrial Park on Suncrest Dr. Turn left onto Dillon Court. The Gray site is the building on the right across the street from the Grand Furniture Warehouse.

Northeast State at Kingsport - 222. W. Main St. (Student Services) From West Kingsport:

Proceed east on Stone Drive. Turn right on Fairview Ave. Follow Fairview to the end, turn left on East Center Street. Proceed on Center Street until you come to the intersection at Clinchfield St. Turn right at the traffic light. Domtar is on the corner to your right. Go one block and Northeast State at Kingsport is on your left at the corner of W. Main St. and Clay St. directly across the street from CSX Transportation.

From Sullivan Gardens, Rock Springs areas:

From Interstate 26, take the Wilcox Drive Exit. Proceed on Wilcox Drive toward downtown Kingsport. Turn left on Sullivan St. after you go under the bridge overpass on Wilcox. Go one






